- POSITION:** Internship – Climate Resilience Capacity Building Program – 2 positions
- LOCATION:** At any one of the following: Beaver Lake Cree Nation, Cold Lake First Nations, Frog Lake First Nations, Heart Lake First Nation, Kehewin Cree Nation, Whitefish Lake First Nation #128, Tribal Chiefs Ventures Inc. St. Paul office.
- TERM:** 3-4 months (July 2022-March 2023), up to 20 hours per week

Overview

Tribal Chiefs Ventures Inc. (TCVI) is currently seeking two Interns to coordinate and support the Climate Resilience Capacity Building Program funded by Municipal Climate Change Action Centre. The project aims to understand past, current, and future climate trends by incorporating both scientific and Traditional Ecological Knowledge. The project also identifies key areas where climate change could impact the First Nations and investigates local actions to manage risks and opportunities. The interns should be primarily based on the above-mentioned First Nations or within driving distance to the First Nations in the TCVI region.

Job description

The interns will closely work with a team identified by Leadership which consists of environmental science, climate change, and engineering backgrounds. As an intern with the Climate Resilience Capacity Building Program, the successful candidate will proactively conduct qualitative studies, including:

- Conduct multiple field trips to the First Nations, including support meetings and workshops
- Administer interviews with students, band office staff, Elders, knowledge keepers, and the band members
- Conduct research on past, current, and future climate trends
- Collect data from interviews and workshops and help preparing field reports
- Support in executing Climate Resilience Capacity Building program in all six member First Nations
- Other duties as assigned.

- Students or early career researcher interested in environment science, natural resource management, climate change, water resources preferred.
- Preference will be given to local students with Indigenous background
- Able to commute to the member First Nations on frequent basis - essential
